Read it Forward!

During the first two weeks of December masked SLAC (Student Library Advisory Council) Members will hide books around the school. If you are an in-person student and you find a book hidden while you are at school, you may take it home and read it. You will have until the New Year to finish it. Once you have finished the book, you can tell a librarian, and they will ask you a few questions about the book/talk with you about the book. By doing this, they are making sure that you have indeed read it. Once they are convinced that you have read the book, your name will be entered into a drawing for a Kindle, and you will also get a candy cane, so you might want to find a book! Don't worry DLI students; every day three DLI students will be drawn for Read it Forward, and the library will contact those students to pick up their wrapped book from the library. Once a DLI student has finished their book, they can email or chat a librarian, and they will "quiz" you online. After you have finished the book and answered the questions about it, you can either keep the book, or you can return it to library and they will "quarantine" (aka sanitize) and then pass it on.
